

Energy-saving street lamps in town

Five new energy-saving LED decorative street lamps have been installed on the west side of the 400 block of Baltimore Street as a result of a partnership between the Borough of Gettysburg and Columbia Gas, as well as fundraising efforts facilitated through Main Street Gettysburg (MSG).

In addition to the street lamps, brick sidewalks were included in the completion of the demonstration block for the Baltimore Street Revitalization Project.

The fundraising efforts, headed by retired MSG board member Ron Hankey, raised \$21,100 from the following donors: Adams County Community Foundation, Destination Gettysburg, Gettysburg Foundation, Gettysburg Rotary Club, and the National Trust for Historic Gettysburg.

In addition to the cash donations, the Gettysburg Area Retail Merchants Association purchased wreaths to be placed on the lamp posts during the holiday season.

The demonstration block project resulted from the partnership between the borough and Columbia Gas to replace aging gas lines throughout the borough and provided an opportunity to showcase how improvements on Baltimore Street will benefit the borough.
